The Bridge of the Americas (Puente de las Américas) is Panama City's most iconic crossing—where the Pan-American Highway leaps over the Pacific entrance to the Canal. Designed by American civil engineering company Sverdrup & Parcel, it was completed in 1962 at a cost of US\$ 20.
